Battling the Elements on Exposed Coastlines

Coastal engineering sites are arguably the most punishing work environments in the construction sector. Machinery is constantly exposed to driving rain, corrosive salt spray, and highly abrasive blowing sand. The machinery deployed must be exceptionally rugged, featuring sealed electrical components and heavy-duty drivetrains designed to withstand extreme conditions. Shifting Heavy Rock Armour and Shingle

The primary method for absorbing the devastating energy of crashing waves is the installation of rock armour—massive, interlocking boulders placed at the base of cliffs or sea walls. Additionally, beach nourishment involves importing thousands of tonnes of coarse shingle or sand to rebuild eroded shorelines. Moving these incredibly heavy, awkward materials from the delivery drop-off point down onto the

active beach requires serious mechanical power. Articulated earthmovers, boasting massive payload capacities and robust reinforced skips, are the only vehicles capable of handling this brutal task. They can effortlessly ferry heavy loads of rock armour across the uneven beach, delivering the materials exactly where the specialised long-reach excavators need them for final placement.

Operating Machinery on Unstable Sand

The greatest logistical challenge of beach work is the terrain itself. Soft, deep sand and waterlogged shingle provide virtually zero traction for standard construction vehicles. Attempting to drive a normal truck onto a beach will almost certainly result in it becoming hopelessly bogged down, requiring an expensive and embarrassing rescue operation. Coastal groundworks demand the use of articulated machinery equipped with highly specialised, extra-wide flotation tyres. These tyres significantly reduce the ground pressure of the fully loaded machine, allowing it to 'float' over the soft, shifting surface rather than sinking into it. This superior traction and stability are absolutely essential for moving heavy materials across the beach safely and efficiently.

Timing Groundworks with Tidal Shifts

Time is the ultimate enemy when working on coastal defences. The entire construction schedule is dictated not by the clock, but by the relentless rhythm of the tides. When the tide recedes, crews have a strictly limited window of opportunity to excavate footings, pour marine concrete, and place rock armour before the ocean returns to swallow the work area. In this high-pressure environment, the speed of material transport is critical. Having a fleet of fast, highly capable earthmovers ensures that aggregate and rock are moved onto the beach the moment the tide allows, and that the machinery can be swiftly evacuated to higher ground as the water rises. This rapid, highly choreographed logistical flow is the key to successfully securing the coastline.
